In our Art & Design lessons, we strive to inspire pupil's curiosity about art and ensure all pupils have the opportunity to produce creative, imaginative work. Children are encouraged to explore their ideas and record their experiences, as well as exploring the work of others and evaluate different creative ideas.

Our aim is for children to become confident and proficient in a variety of techniques including drawing, painting, sculpting, as well as other selected craft skills, e.g. collage and printing. Children will also develop their knowledge of colour theory, famous artists, designers, and craft makers.

Take a trip to Oxford to visit the Ashmolean museum. The Eastern Art Department houses sculpture, textiles, ceramics and paintings from the Islamic Middle East, China, Japan, Southeast Asia, India and the Himalayas. The Department of Western Art houses outstanding collections of European fine and decorative arts from the Renaissance to the present day. They include Old Master and later paintings, drawings, watercolours



and prints, and English and continental ceramics, sculpture, silver, watches, rings and musical instruments.

Book recommendations

EYFS

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum supports children through the planning and teaching of 'Expressive art and design'. Expressive Arts and Design encompass a wide breadth of creative areas, such as listening and responding to music, singing, dancing and performing, experimenting with colour mixing and different textures, creating models, for example, junk modelling, small world, construction and role play. Every day, children are encouraged to develop independence and autonomy when creating. They are given opportunities to explore their creative side and make choices about their work by having free access to art and craft materials during continuous provision time.
